Note: This is an attempt at a verbatim typescript of three record pages from a Bible "stereotyped by E. & J. White", New York, 1828, and now in the possession of Miss Frances Armistead, Farmville, Prince Edward County, Virginia. Presumably, the Bible at various times belonged to Capt. Sharp Spencer's grandson, James Anderson Armistead (1793-1876), and to the latter's son, Drury Lacy Armistead, Sr. (ca. 1840-1911), and grandson, James Ashby Armistead (1869-1950), all of Prince Edward. A photocopy of the original record is in the Virginia State Library, Richmond. All entries appear to be in the same hand, except for the two deaths at the bottom of the second page. Some of the week-days, as noted above, are not always consistent with days of month and year of the perpetual calendar consulted by this compiler.
