16 ¶ Then they that feared the LORD spake often one to another; and the LORD hearkened and heard it: and a book of remembrance was written before him for them that feared the LORD, and that thought upon his name.

17 And they shall be mine, saith the LORD of hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels; and I will spare them, as a man spareth his own son that serveth him.

CHAP. IV.

1 God's judgment on the wicked, 2 and his blessing on the good. 4 He exhorteth to the study of the law, 5 and telleth of Elijah's coming and office.

FOR, behold, the day cometh that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh

shall burn them up, saith the LORD of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch.

2 ¶ But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall.

3 And ye shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do this, saith the LORD of hosts.

4 ¶ Remember ye the law of Moses my servant, which I commanded unto him in Horeb for all Israel, with the statutes and judgments.

5 ¶ Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the LORD:

6 And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse.

*Zepho*, that sees and observes, that expects or covers.  
*Zerah*, see *Zarah*.  
*Zereda*, ambush, change of dominion.  
*Zereph*, misery, strange or dispersed inheritance.  
*Zeror*, root, that straitens or binds, that keeps tight.  
*Zeruah*, leprous, wasp, hornet.  
*Zerubbabel*, a stranger at Babylon, dispersion of confusion.  
*Zeruah*, pain, tribulation.  
*Zethar*, he that examines, or beholds.  
*Ziba*, army, fight, strength.  
*Zibeon*, iniquity that dwells.  
*Zibiah*, the Lord dwells.  
*Zichri*, that remembers, that is a male.  
*Zidon*, hunting, fishing, venison.  
*Zif*, this or that; brightness.  
*Ziklag*, measure pressed down.
